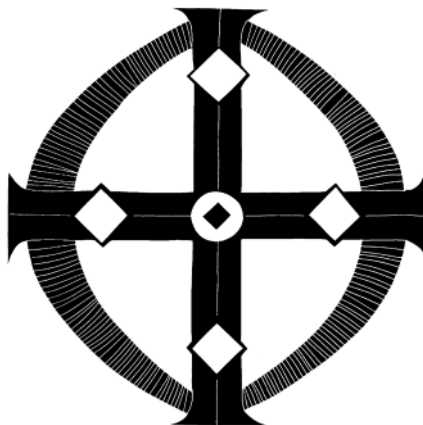


PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

Assembly: **It is right and just.**




