21:28-32

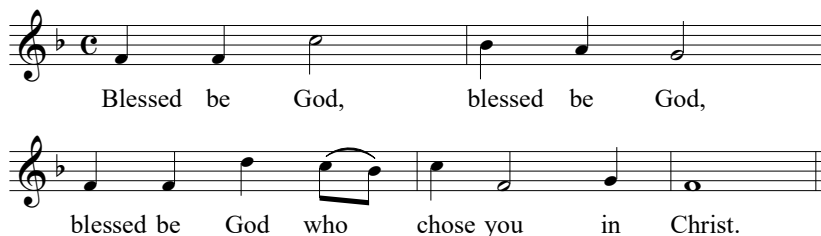




