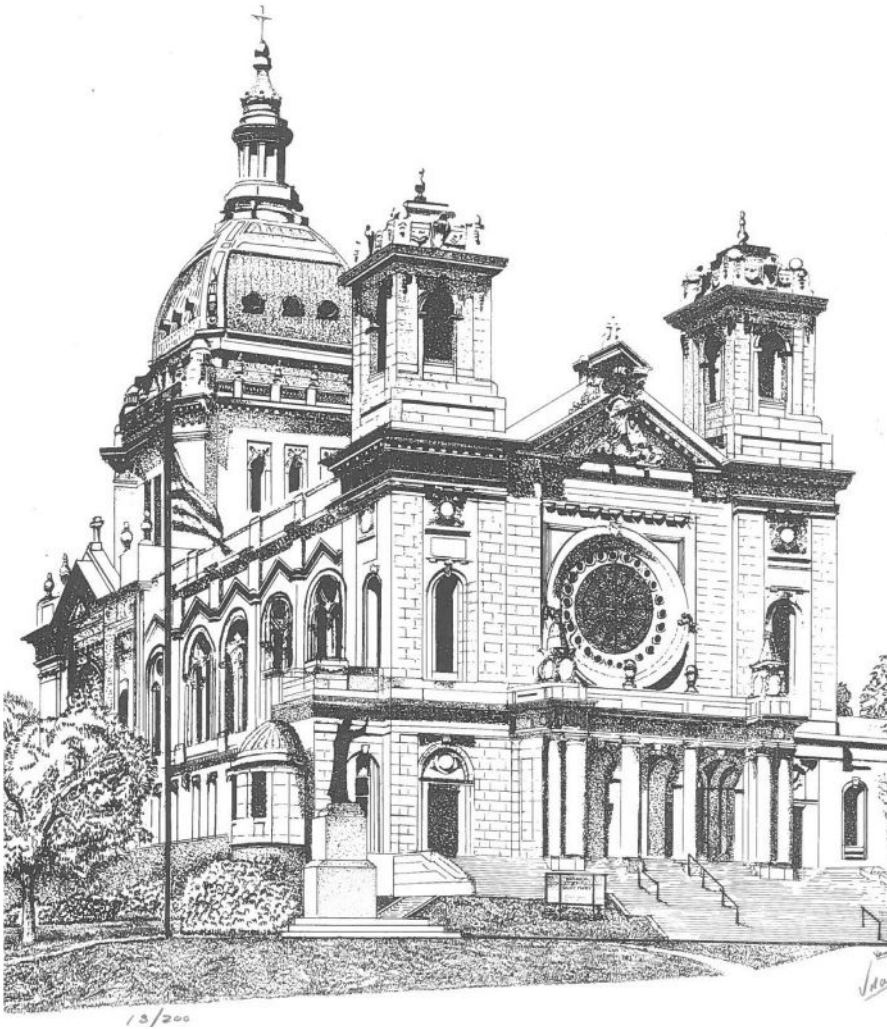

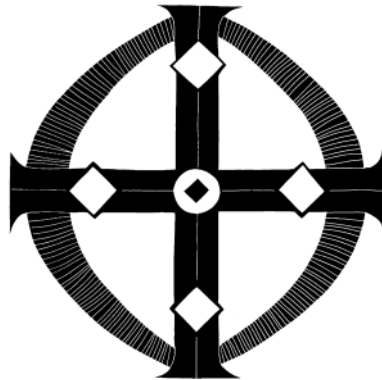

Assembly: **And with your spirit.**






