## GREETING

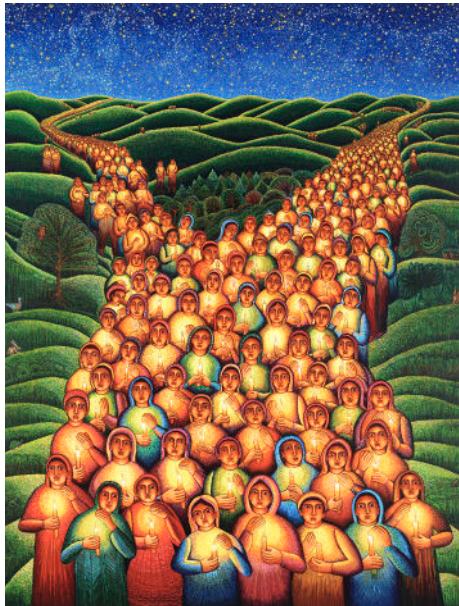

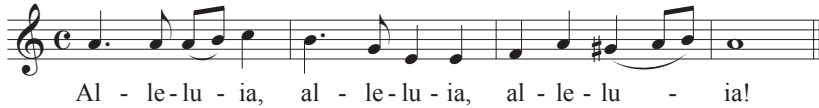

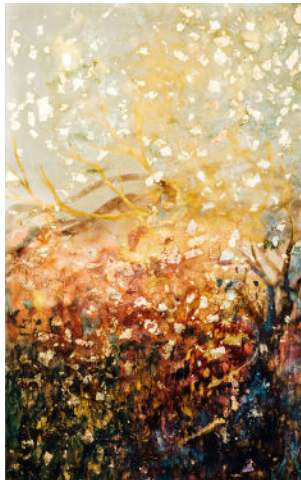
