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## A READING FROM THE LETTER OF SAINT PAUL TO THE ROMANS

10:9-18

Brothers and sisters:

If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord  
and believe in your heart that God raised him from  
the dead, you will be saved.

For one believes with the heart and so is justified,  
and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved.

The Scripture says,

No one who believes in him will be put to shame.

There is no distinction between Jew and Greek;  
the same Lord is Lord of all,  
enriching all who call upon him.

For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will  
be saved.

But how can they call on him in whom they have not  
believed?

And how can they believe in him of whom they have

and what is heard comes through the word of Christ.

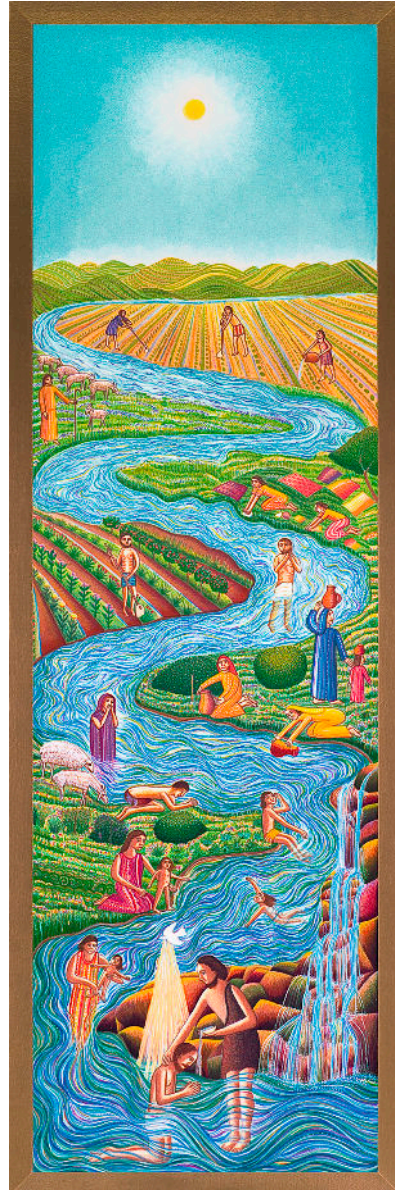
But I ask, did they not hear?

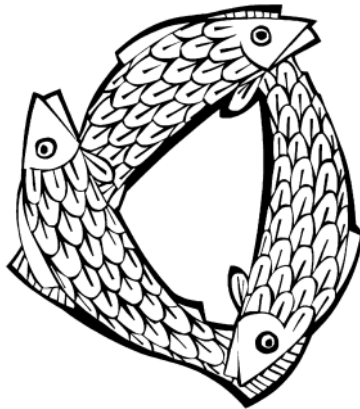

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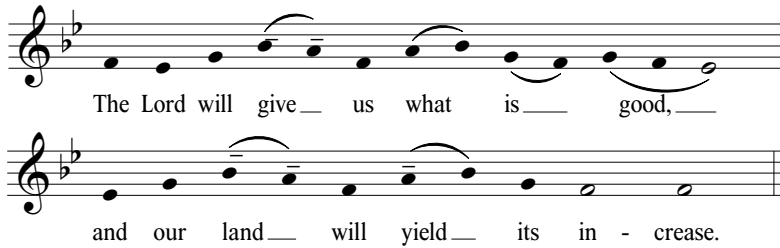
## INVITATION TO COMMUNION

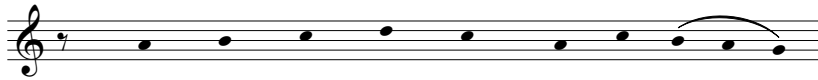
