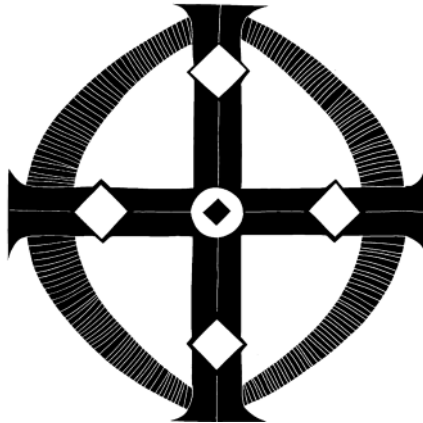

and in the house of my God I will live forever.


PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

Assembly: **It is right and just.**




