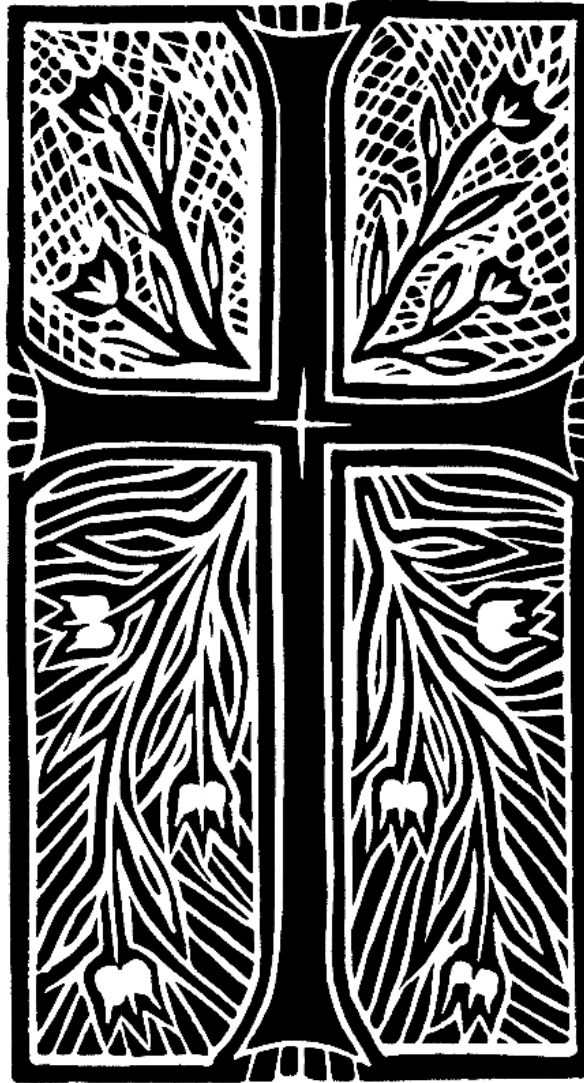

## GREETING

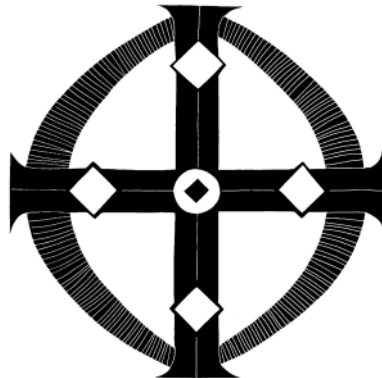
Priest: In the name of the Father, and of the Son,

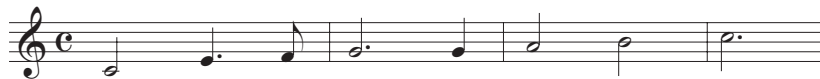

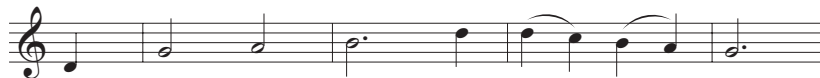

Our dearly beloved Steve, age 77, of Hopkins passed away peacefully on April 22, 2024, after a brief illness. He was born in Ramona, South Dakota, the oldest of five children. He continued to dedicate his free time to his family, his church and various committees. Along with these committees he found time to coach many youth sports leagues. These groups all benefitted greatly from his skills and rules of life – based on honesty and integrity.

As years went by and the family grew, Steve delighted in spending time in the company of his children and grandchildren, the true joys of his life. He relished every moment he was with them. Whether it was trips to a playground, sporting events, coaching their teams, making dyed “papa’s eggs”, supervising sleepovers or just being a taxi driver he was in his ‘happy place’.

Trying to fill the void we feel by Steve’s passing is not possible. We can now only cherish our wonderfully poignant memories of time we spent with him, remembering his integrity, kindness, warmth and smile.
