Jesus Christ.

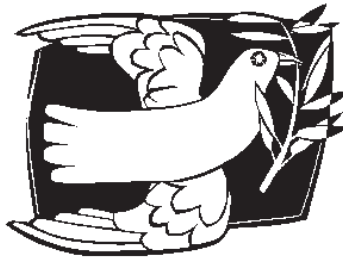

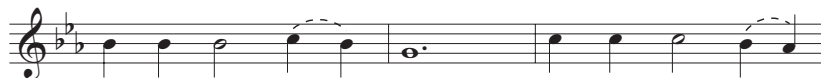
